Another Friend Has Passed - Catherine (Rena) Laird

Rena Laird died peacefully on 24 July, just months short of her 102nd birthday. According to her wish, there has been no obituary, and no funeral or memorial. However, we did not want to let the occasion pass without some notice. Some of the following was published at the time of her 100th birthday. We think it bears repeating.

Rena and her husband Adam came to Winnipeg from Scotland in the 1940s when Adam took on a position with the Winnipeg Grain Exchange. We became friends with Adam and Rena after we began Scottish Country Dancing in the late 1970s and for many years were fortunate recipients of the famous Laird hospitality. Rena herself became involved with SCD and attended classes while Adam, an excellent pianist, was recruited by John Trevenen to be involved with the creation of a Scottish Country Dance Band which was named "Scotch Measure". They produced a CD in 1997 entitled "Skip-Change With Scotch Measure", and for many years we were able to have wonderful local live music for all our socials, workshops and balls.

Rena was a wonderful friend to many of us; funny, smart and accomplished at so many things including her "Address to the Haggis", delivered often at our RSCDS Burns Dinners. One of the "good ones"!!

Rena also had a great love for 4 legged furry friends within her home and family over the years. Our dogs, Maggie, Jessie, and now Hachi, were always welcomed by Rena when we visited and the lucky recipients of Rena's very generous handfuls of doggy treats (and occasionally something sweet made by Doreen or Rena was passed under the table!)

She is, and will continue to be missed and remembered by all of us who knew Rena, but most especially by her caring and attentive Winnipeg family, Doreen, Rod and grandchildren, and great-grandchildren, and we send our sincere condolences to the family.




Teacher Candidates
