Magaret Zadworny

We were very sad to learn that another branch teacher, Margaret Zadworny, passed away October 13th. Margaret was a Winnipeg Branch Life member, and an organizer of the very first Mug Pub. Not only was she a dancer in the early days of the branch, but also went on to become a teacher, dance deviser, and the Mother of Ladies Step Dancing in North America.

Margaret taught Scottish Country Dance classes and Ladies Step dancing for many years and was very well known around the world for the creative dances she devised. Her Aye Afloat book of Scottish Country dances with music composed by Muriel Johnstone was published in 2007 and dedicated to the town of Portnockie in Scotland where Margaret grew up. This past spring a compilation of her Step Dances, The Smitty Piper Collection, was published.

With the encouragement of Joan Cameron Muir, Margaret started the Braemar dancers to perform at various Scottish events. Not only did Margaret work dancers through the McNabb Collection of Dances, choreograph entrances and exits, step dances, etc. but also made all the costumes. She was also wonderful with children and her children's class was large enough that she put on an end of the year show. Again, Margaret sewed skirts and sashes for each child (custom fit).

Margaret's legacy is extensive and will live on for years and years to come.
