manage tight turns. It has an interesting corner figure which requires some fly-a-way whirling to stay with the music, but lots of fun once you know where you are going. We got to practice the elegant figure of the knot in preparation for "Triple Happiness", a dance from Japan. "The Shamrock Girl" also came up on the dance menu. The floral name might lead you to think of a pastoral dance, but make no mistake, this one needs all brain cells firing and feet to match. The dance keeps everyone moving as both men and ladies take part in reels of four on the sides and all couples are involved in a half diamond pousette to finish.

In recognition of Valentine's Day, we danced "The Kissing Bridge" by Romaine Butterfield. To perfect this dance, Sharyl had us pay particular attention to mirror reels, encouraging us to meet our partners shoulder to shoulder, which helped with timing and symmetry of this figure. Partners also got to do a "twirl under" on bar 4 of leading down and back. Sharyl broke this down into a basic walking route so we all knew where we were heading when we "twirled under" to music.

A couple of enjoyable "cool down" dances popped up. "Star Trek" provided lots of opportunity to get lost in outer space, but it did have a bit of narration to remind the dancer of what was coming next. "Ha! Ha! The Wo'in O' It was an easy and fun dance to end the class before we broke for Valentine's goodies courtesy of the social committee.
