In 1981, when my late wife and I first joined RSCDS Winnipeg, John was a young teacher going through the rigours of teacher certification and exams. He was both an accomplished teacher and a genuinely nice person. Later John married and took on the responsibility of step children, not unlike myself. With his new responsibilities as a father, and a demanding job at Gerdau (MRM) Steel in Selkirk, John withdrew from teaching and Winnipeg Branch.
