Quinton McNaught recently celebrated his 90th birthday with SCD friends with dancing and cake. Quinton joined the Branch in 1973, never having danced before, and has been a keen dancer ever since.

He was involved in dancing at Folklorama and was Mayor of the British pavilion Mug Pub (under the RSCDS) on two occasions. He attended the RSCDS summer school in St. Andrews, Scotland, in 1977. Ouinton has twice served as chair of the Branch.

He obtained his teacher's certificate in 1983, and was an active teacher for 17 years. During this time, he was the teacher's representative to the Committee of Management on a number of occasions. As teachers' rep he represented the Branch teachers at conferences of the Teacher's Association of Canada (TAC) at Brock University, and at San Francisco.

Over the years, he was a member of the demonstration team, and with other dancers, was honoured to dance for the Queen on the occasion of her visit to Winnipeg in 1984.

After 46 years of dancing, Quinton continues to enjoy his participation with the Branch in the Monday social class.
