50TH Anniversary Workshop and Ball update

In preparation for what was anticipated to be the 50th Annual Workshop and Ball in 2021, Jane Nattrass and I took on the task of co-chairing the Workshop Committee for 2021. We started to look at possible venues, and out of town musicians were booked for the event. Then everything stopped.

During the past few weeks, however, both of us came to the conclusion that holding a major workshop event in Spring 2021 was less and less likely to be possible or successful. Social distancing and stay at home recommendations are slowly being lifted, but as virtually all group events began to be cancelled through September with no indication that a return to group events will be lifted even then, it became clear that it is likely that any recovery to normal activity may not begin until January at the earliest and may last well into 2021.

We have, with regret, come to the conclusion that holding a major event in 2021 that would involve out of town teachers, musicians, and guests is not feasible. We both agreed that it was only fair to cancel our commitment to the musicians that were booked for 2021 and to move tentative dates to 2022. We were pleased that consultations with the COM and the 2020 Workshop Committee supported this plan.

Frank was a pharmacist researcher with a focus on Nuclear Pharmacy. Frank and Shirley left Winnipeg for other research centres – London, Los Angeles, Toronto & Ottawa where he retired. He and Shirley found Scottish Country Dancing wherever they went.
