Reading Sharon Bettess’ story (in last L & A issue) has prompted me to submit mine as well – my mother was a Fraser too! My grandparents (Helen and Robert) immigrated to Winnipeg from Bo’ness, West Lothian in the early 1920’s. Growing up I spent a lot of time with my granny as they lived just down the street and/or I lived with them. She loved to play her 45 rpm records of Scottish music which I now know as jigs and reels. She taught me to make shortbread and scones, to love mealy (white) pudding, a piece and cheese, and lunch on the lawn.

In 2005, our now son-in-law announced that he was accepted to the Royal Scottish Academy of Music and Drama in Glasgow and that our daughter Sheena was going with him. They spent a full year living in the dodgy east end (we visited in spring 2006) and then decided that they would have a Scottish wedding when they returned home, complete with kilts and Ceilidh dancing. Simon was fitted for his kilt before he left for home and chose the Fraser Hunting Ancient colours, which was the tartan that my grandmother had chosen for her skirt outfit, when she visited home in the 1960’s.

So in September 2006 I signed up for the beginner class. Sheena came to some of the classes but she had also signed up for university courses which conflicted. She has attended several Workshop events. Simon is not too interested in the country dances but he had done clogging with the Danseurs de la Riviere Rouge growing up. We enjoyed some Ceilidh dances like Strip the Willow and Gay Gordons, (which they had done at the pub in Scotland), at the wedding with the help of several of Sheena’s dancing friends. We danced to the Scotch Measure CD.

As we stayed apart this Christmas, our family recalled that Christmas of 2005 when Sheena and Simon could not come home for the holidays and our other daughter Kat went to Scotland to be with them, so we were by ourselves for the first time. We have a DVD of the Glasgow celebrations which they *mailed* to us to stay in touch! How much easier it is now to stay connected.
