Thursday Afternoon

It is so wonderful to be dancing again, even with the few restrictions still remaining (we wear masks and sanitize our hands after each dance). It's not St. Paul's and it's not our Monday, Tuesday and Thursday evening classes, but this is what is available right now. Hopefully we can start an evening

class in the fall, so that the rest of our members can return as well. Maybe even some spring or summer dances to help make up for the lost companionship of our fellow dancers.
