

Iona McPhee 1927 – 2021

Recently we lost a long time friend to many of us and a former Scottish Country Dancer with the Winnipeg Branch. Iona McPhee passed away August 28, 2021 at the age of 93.

Iona joined the branch in 1974 and was in the beginners' class taught by the late Mary Nixon. She was very active in the branch, dancing in the technique classes, Fort Garry social class and with the Scottish Entertainers. She served on the Committee of Management in various capacities over the years including chair. She supported and volunteered at Mug Pub even serving as Mayor. Iona was an avid volunteer for many organizations including the WSO and the Manitoba Music Festival, evidence of her passion for music and dance. It was at the Manitoba Music Festival where I first met Iona, she as a volunteer and I as a participant playing the piano, completely unaware that some 30 years later she would become a good friend and fellow dancer!

Iona is an example of the impact that Scottish Country Dancing has had on me and on many other members and the resulting nearly life long friendships that have developed due to a common bond – the love of music and dance. Iona was one of “the girls” right up until just before her passing. This was, and still remains, a group of friends originating from within the branch. We enjoyed many get togethers, birthday celebrations, other special occasions we celebrated and, when unable to get together in person due to the pandemic, we visited via zoom even as recently as this summer. Iona enjoyed traveling to workshops I have mentioned in the past – Regina and Kenora. Iona was a petite fun loving lady with a positive attitude, a witty sense of humour and was always “dressed to the nines”, being totally color coordinated from head to toe. I don't ever remember a time when she was not! We would often joke about the numerous pairs of shoes and earrings she had to match her many very stylish outfits.

In closing I would like to emphasize as I have in the past that SCD is not only about the music and the dance but something even greater. It's about the people and the many long time friendships that have developed as a result, and I know there are many! Thank you Iona for all the good times, the wonderful memories and thank you to the Winnipeg branch of the RSCDS for being the stimulus for these friendships to form and to flourish!
